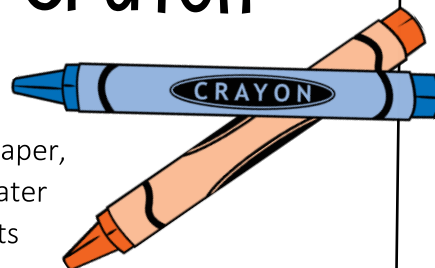


Letter Hide+seek



Cut out pieces of paper and have your child write the letters of their name on the pieces of paper (or you can write them for them). Then Mom or Dad, or a brother or sister can hide all the letters in a room. Lastly, have your child go find all their letters and practice putting the letters back in order to spell their name.

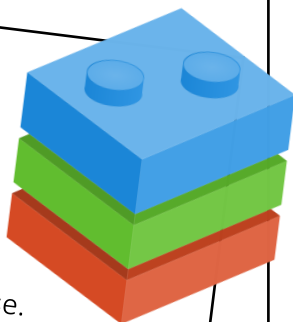
Invisible Crayon Drawings



You will need: white paper, white crayon, small water bowl, watercolor paints and paint brush. Use a white crayon on white paper to draw a picture or write your name. Then use different watercolor paints to paint over the crayon and watch the markings appear like magic!

Measuring

You can use pennies, Legos, regular blocks, or anything that is the same size to measure items around the house. When you're done measuring, count and write the numbers for each item.



Charting Animals

First, predict animals you might see on a walk, sitting in your backyard or just looking out your window and put them on a chart. You can draw your own pictures or them from a magazine. Draw boxes next to them and color or put an X in the box each time you see that animal. You can do this all at once or continue all day!



Jumping on X's

Make a line of Xs 3-6 inches apart on the floor (depending on how far your child can jump) using masking tape or, if it is safe for you to be outdoors, on the driveway using chalk. Demonstrate for your child how to jump from one X to the next. Invite your child to jump from one X to the next until they reach the last X. Then have your child turn around and jump back to the other end of the line.
